

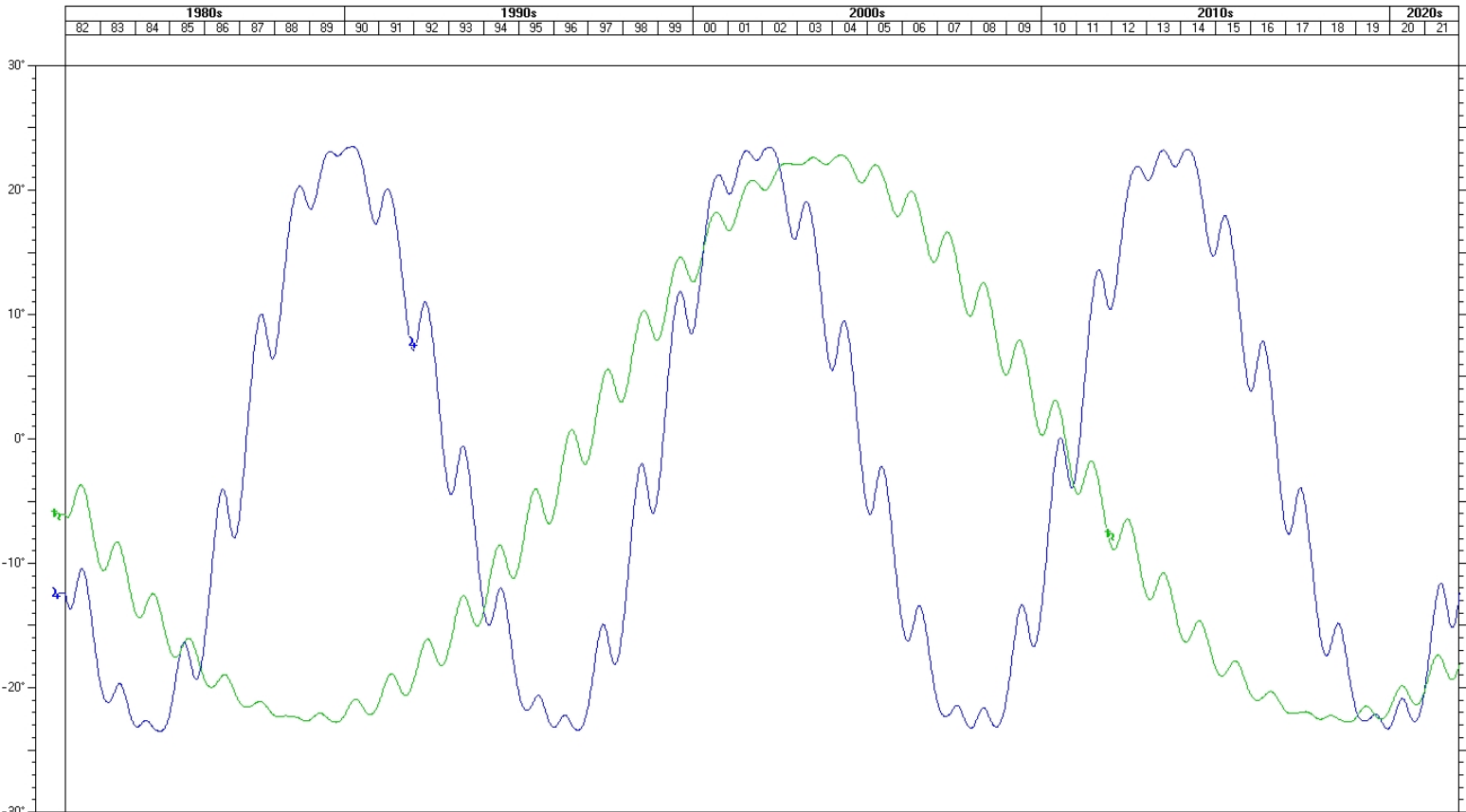
'Saturn invisible for 15 years'

In the second lecture RS makes this comment, which is then literally interpreted by some BD commentators.

Saturn is NEVER invisible in the night sky for 15 years. The Sun excludes the visibility of Saturn for about 3 months of every year.

The 15 year cycle RS is talking about is related to Saturn's declination. (green curve, blue is Jupiter) It spend 15 years above the ecliptic (0 degree) and 15 years below the ecliptic.

Either RS was wrong or he has been 'badly' interpreted.



Regarding Saturn forces coming through the Earth.

With the Earth spinning round once a day, Saturn will always ray its forces directly for half the day, everyday.
